SOUTH AFRICA ON THE EVE OF CHOCK SUMMARY

- 1. INTERNAL SITUATION REMAINS SUBSTANTIALLY UNALTERED. GOVERN-MENT'S WORST HANDICAP IS A VIRTUAL LOSS OF CREDIBILITY AMONG BLACKS. HARD TO SEE HOW THEY CAN REGAIN THIS. FURTHER EXTERNAL PRESSURE ON GOVERNMENT ALONE UNLIKELY TO FORCE THEIR HAND. DETAIL
- 2. IN SHOULD LIKE TO BE ABLE TO REPORT SOME CHINKS OF LIGHT BUT CANNOT HONESTLY DO SO. THE VIOLENCE AND UNREST CONTINUE.

 ALTHOUGH THE GOVERNMENT ARE COMMITTED TO REFORM AND DIALOGUE,
 IN MY VIEW GENUINELY, FEW BLACKS NOW BELIEVE THEM AND NONE ARE
 PREPARED TO SAY SO PUBLICLY OR TO NEGOTIATE ON THE GOVERNMENT'S TERMS. THE PRESIDENT'S DURBAN SPEECH HAD A DISASTROUS
 EFFECT NOT JUST ABROAD BUT AT HOME. REGARDLESS OF CONTENT, ITS
 STYLE AND TONE WERE SO UTTERLY MISCALCULATED THAT HT ONLY PROVED
 HOW FAR THE GOVERNMENT (OR AT LEAST THE PRESIDENT HIMSELF) WERE
 FROM UNDERSTANDING THE MOOD AMONG BLACKS.
- 3. NOTHING HAS GONE RIGHT SINCE THEN. GOVERNMENT SUPPORTERS ARE LEFT UNCERTAIN HOW THE CRISIS CAN BE DEFUSED. A SURPRISING NUMBER OF THEM SEEM READY TO ACCEPT CHANGE: INTEGRATED HOUSING AND SCHOOL-ING EXCEPTED. THE GOVERNMENT THEMSELVES APPEAR HESITANT. EVEN RESPONSIBLE BLACKS ARE CAUGHT UP IN A VINEW PREVALENT IN THE TOWN-SHIPS THAT THE GOVERNMENT ARE UNDER SUCH INTERNAL AND EXTERNAL PRESSURE THAT 'ONE MORE HEAVE' SHOULD BRING THEM DOWN WITHIN THE NEXT YEAR OR SO. THIS SHOWS THE EXTENT OF THE GOVERNMENT'S CREDIBILITY GAP. IT ALSO SUGGESTS A SERIOUS MISREADING OF AFRICANCE RESOLVE BY THE BLACKS IF THEY THINK THE GOVERNMENT CAN BE FORCED TO CAPITULATE.
- 4. IF BELIEVE IT IS STILL NOT TOO LATE FOR THE GOVERNMENT TO RETRIEVE THE SITUATION, ALTHOUGH THEIR IMMEDIATE SIGHTS ARE SET ON FIVE WHITE BY-ELECTIONS AT THE END OF OCTOBER. THEY HAVE ALSO CALLED A SPECIAL MEETING OF THEIR PARLIAMENTARY PARTY ON 19 NOVEMBER, WHICH WE ARE TOLD IS INTENDED TO PREPARE FOR IMPORTANT CHANGES IN THE NEXT SESSION OF PARLIAMENT.
- IMPROVE THE PROSPECTS FOR DIALOGUE. FOR INSTANCE THEY COULD BEGIN
 TO WITHDRAW POLICE AND ARMY FROM TOWNSHIPS, WHICH IS NOW A PRIMARY
 BLACK DEMAND ALTHOUGH THOSE BLACKS LINKED TO GOVERNMENT BEG THEM
 NOT TO FOR FEAR OF THEIR LIVES. THEY COULD ANNOUNCE ABOLITION
 OF THE PASS LAWS AS RECOMMENDED IN A RECENT REPORT. THE GOVERNMENT WILL ONE DAY HAVE TO TALK TO THE AND WITHOUT PRE-CONDITIONS
 AS THE LEADER OF THE OPPOSITION HAS NOW DONE. THIS WOULD HOWEVER
 CONSTITUTE A MAJOR U-TURN AND MAY NOT OCCUR UNTIL PRESIDENT
 BOTHA HIMSELF STEPS DOWN A DECISION WHICH WHEN IT COMES,
 AND DEPENDING ON HIS SUCCESSOR, COULD BE THE BIGGEST SIGNAL YET
 FOR A NEW APPROACH. CONFIDENTIAL

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6. HOW DOES CONTINUED EXTERNAL PRESSURE FIT INTO THIS PICTURE?

ONE CANNOT BE CERTAIN HOW FAR MEASURES BY FOREIGN GOVERNMENTS HAVE

SPEEDED UP THE COURSE OF REFORM. THE MOST ONE CAN SAY IS THAT

SUCH MEASURES MAY HAVE HELPED IN CASES LIKE KWA NGEMA AND HAVE

ADDED TO OTHER GENERAL PRESSURES ON THE SOUTH AFRICAN GOVERNMENT.

EXTERNALLY THE DRYING UP OF FOREIGN CREDIT IS THE OBVIOUS EXAMPLE

OF A MOVE REALLY FELT HERE. IN SUSPECT THAT TRADE UNION BLACKING

OF SOUTH AFRICAN CARGOES MIGHT BECOME ANOTHER. A NET OUTFLOW OF

CAPITAL COUPLED WITH LOSS OF EXPORTS WOULD SERIOUSLY DAMAGE AN

ECONOMY ALREADY UNDER SEVERE INTERNAL STRAIN AND WOULD LIMIT

GOVERNMENT SPENDING ON HOUSING, UNEMPLOYMENT ETC, ALL OF WHICH THE

GOVERNMENT WILL STRIVE HARD TO AVOID.

7. AS REGARDS FURTHER ACTIONS BY GOVERNMENTS AGAINST SOUTH
AFRICA WE HAVE ALMOST REACHED THE STAGE WHERE THESE WOULD MERELY
MAKE THE SOUTH AFRICANS DIEG THEIR TOES IN. TAKEN BEYOND A CERTAIN
POINT THIS REACTION WOULD BE A RECIPE FOR TOTAL DISASTER. PRESIDENT BOTHA'S PLEAS TO THE REST OF THE WORLD IS 'LEAVE US IN PEACE'.
BY THEIR LIGHTS THEY HAVE TAKEN RISKS IN INTRODUCING OR ANNOUNCING CHANGE, YET FIND THEMSELVES SCORNED BY BLACKS AND FOREIGNERS ALIKE. THEIR EXPERIMENT IN CONTROLLED REFORM THREATENS TO
RUN OUT OF CONTROL. IN THEIR VIEW MORE AND MORE PRESSURE FROM
ABROAD NOW SERVES TO STIFFEN EXTREME BLACK DEMANDS.

8. IT AM INCREASINGLY INCLINED TO THINK WE SHOULD DIRECT OUR OWN HOPES FOR DIALOGUE AND PEACEFUL CHANGE TO BLACKS AS WELL AS TO THE GOVERNMENT. PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITY RESTS WITH THE GOVERNMENT. PRESSURE ON THEM SHOULD THEREFORE BE MAINTAINED. THE GOVERNMENT STILL HAVE TO OFFER MORE, PARTICULARLY ON POLITICAL RIGHTS. BUT IN THE FINAL ANALYSIS IT TAKES TWO TO COMPROMISE. THERE MAY COME A TIME WHEN BLACKS WHETHER INSIDE OR OUTSIDE SOUTH AFRICA WILL ALSO HAVE TO SHOW A GREATER SENSE OF REALISM, HARD AS IT WOULD BE FOR US OR ANYONE ELSE TO PUT SUCH A MESSAGE ACROSS IN PRESENT CIRCUMSTANCES.
