1. CHINA: DESCENT INTO CHAOS

[IN THE WESTERN EDGE OF THE CITY, ACCORDING TO PRESS REPORTS, ELEMENTS OF THE 38TH ARMY CLASHED WITH THE 27TH ARMY, WHICH IS BEING BLAMED FOR THE WORST ATROCITIES AGAINST CIVILIANS DURING SATURDAY NIGHT'S ATTACK ON TIANANMEN SQUARE.

AN UNCONFIRMED HONG KONG TELEVISION BROADCAST TODAY REPORTED FIGHTING AT NANYUAN MILITARY AIRPORT, WHERE SEVERAL THOUSAND FRESH TROOPS MAY HAVE ARRIVED TODAY FROM THE NANJING MILITARY REGION, [] THE NANJING COMMANDER IS BELIEVED TO BE PERSONALLY LOYAL TO DENG.

A SECURITY GUARD IN THE GREAT HALL OF THE PEOPLE SHOT PREMIER LI PENG IN THE THIGH YESTERDAY, ACCORDING TO PRESS REPORTS. THE WOULD-BE ASSASSIN WAS IMMEDIATELY KILLED BY SECURITY FORCES. THE REPORT, FROM A RELIABLE HONG KONG NEWSPAPER, WILL GAIN WIDE DISSEMINATION.

SPORADIC GUNFIRE CONTINUED IN THE CENTER OF BEIJING YESTERDAY, WITH SOME CIVILIAN CASUALTIES, ACCORDING TO PRESS REPORTS. TROOPS, SUPPORTED BY TANKS, HAVE TAKEN UP DEFENSIVE POSITIONS NEAR THE US EMBASSY.

STRIKES AND PROTESTS ARE SPREADING TO OTHER CITIES; MARTIAL LAW HAS BEEN DECLARED IN CHENGDU WHERE VIOLENT CLASHES BETWEEN TROOPS AND DEMONSTRATORS HAVE LEFT AT LEAST 300 DEAD. ACCORDING TO THE CONSULATE GENERAL, ON MONDAY NIGHT AN ANGRY MOB TRIED TO BREAK INTO THE HOTEL WHERE THE CONSULATE IS HOUSED, ALTHOUGH LOOTING, RATHER THAN ATTACKS ON FOREIGNERS, WAS BELIEVED TO BE THE PURPOSE. UNCONFIRMED ACCOUNTS SUGGEST THAT TROOPS ARE POISED OUTSIDE SHANGHAI TO INTERVENE IF ORDERED, AND THE CITY IS PARALYZED BY STRIKES AND ROADBLOCKS ERECTED BY PROTESTERS. DEMONSTRATIONS HAVE ALSO OCCURRED IN GUANGZHOU AND OTHER CITIES.

LEADERS AND ARMY COMMANDERS WHO HAVE ORDERED OR CONDUCTED ATROCITIES NOW FEEL THEY ARE FIGHTING FOR THEIR LIVES.

THEY HAVE RINGED THE ZHONGNANHAI LEADERSHIP COMPOUND WITH ARMORED VEHICLES AND TROOPS [

2. HONG KONG: NO CONFIDENCE IN PRC

TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND DEMONSTRATORS PROTESTED YESTERDAY IN THE STREETS AND HONG KONG STOCKS DROPPED 22 PERCENT IN RESPONSE TO NEWS OF VIOLENCE IN BEIJING, ACCORDING TO CONSULATE GENERAL HONG KONG AND PRESS REPORTS. A GENERAL SYMPATHY STRIKE REPORTEDLY IS PLANNED FOR TOMORROW. MASSIVE PROTEST WITHDRAWALS FROM THE PRC-OWNED BANK OF CHINA REQUIRED THE HONG KONG GOVERNMENT TO MAKE EXTRA MONEY AVAILABLE FROM ITS RESERVES. IN THE UK, TORY AND OPPOSITION POLITICIANS HAVE CALLED ON PRIME MINISTER THATCHER TO SEEK NEW ASSURANCES FROM BEIJING ON HONG KONG'S FUTURE.

SOME CLASHES BETWEEN MILITARY UNITS REPORTEDLY HAVE OCCURRED AND MORE ARE POSSIBLE, ESPECIALLY IF TROOPS ARE ORDERED INTO OTHER CITIES.

PRESS REPORTS

INDICATE THAT DENG b1, a4

ON SATURDAY WAS PERSONALLY INVOLVED IN ORDERING THE MILITARY TO USE WHATEVER FORCE WAS NECESSARY TO BREAK THE BACK OF RESISTANCE IN TIANANMEN SQUARE. THE DECISION FOLLOWED AN ATTEMPT ON SATURDAY BY SEVERAL THOUSAND UNARMED TROOPS TO ENTER THE SQUARE; WHEN THEY WERE BLOCKED BY PROTESTERS, ARMED UNITS WERE DEPLOYED WITH ORDERS TO AVOID BLOODSHED IF POSSIBLE. AFTER THEY ENCOUNTERED RESISTANCE, TOP LEADERS ORDERED THEM TO USE DEADLY FORCE.

SATURDAY NIGHT JOURNALISTS REPORTED HEARING SOME SOLDIERS TELLING STUDENTS THEY HAD NOT BEEN ISSUED AMMUNITION OR THEY WOULD HAVE FIRED ON OTHER ARMY UNITS.

THAT SOME UNITS WERE IN FACT SENT IN WITHOUT AMMUNITION. THAT ELEMENTS OF THE 27TH ARMY SKIRMISHED WITH ELEMENTS OF THE 16TH AND 38TH ARMIES, AND PRESS REPORTS SUGGEST THAT IN AT LEAST ONE INSTANCE POLICE MAY HAVE OPENED FIRE ON ARMY UNITS. THE LARGE NUMBER OF ARMORED VEHICLES AND MILITARY TRUCKS DESTROYED BY PROTESTERS SUGGEST COLLUSION BY TROOPS IN AT LEAST SOME CASES. IN ONE INSTANCE TROOPS DISMOUNTED FROM A CONVOY OF SCORES OF VEHICLES AND DID NOT TRY TO PREVENT CIVILIANS FROM BURNING THEM, ACCORDING TO UNCONFIRMED RUMORS.

PRESS REPORTS INDICATE MILITARY UNITS HAVE CLASHED WITH PROTESTERS IN CHENGDU AND CHONGQING. CONVOYS HAVE BEEN SEEN IN OTHER AREAS, AND AN UNCONFIRMED HONG KONG PRESS REPORT SAYS ORDERS HAVE BEEN ISSUED TO MILITARY REGION COMMANDERS TO PREPARE TO DEPLOY TROOPS IN SHANGHAI, NANJING, CHANGSHA, WUHAN, AND GUANGZHOU.
